Foreword by Secretary General

It gives me immense pleasure to be at a stage where Sunshine Society completes five years and enters into the sixth year.

Five years of building a team, learning, connecting and making a difference in the society.

What started as an Idea to collaborate to bring about continuous change, has taken shape now and is constantly evolving to include current needs.

Any lasting and thoughtful change can be brought about by educating the young minds, to make them capable of thinking and deciding. To get them into a stage where they can think, it is very important that the children go to school, follow a routine and get educated.

Sunshine Society's first efforts were to ensure that all the children who did not



go to school start going to school. The first major immediate result was in the reduction in child labour. Instead of coming to work with their mother and father, they were in school studying. You can now see them in their school uniforms after school trying to do their homework and also helping their parents in after school hours! As we were trying to make a difference in the place where we live, we ensured that all the support staff, whose children did not go to school, were counselled and helped to get their children admitted in the schools near their residence. For continuity of the children's education, we ensured that we select a school near to their living area. We are now educating children in the villages of Noida, Greater Noida and Indirapuram. The Model Village project was a result of the need to renovate and build the Government primary school in village Barola, Noida.

What started as an education initiative to enroll 125 children in schools, has now evolved to enroll 250 children in 40 different schools. We also have 3 afterschool study centers helping additional 114 children

Evolving as per the need, made us develop programs on health and hygiene and safety of children. Workshops in various schools and After School Study Programs were organized imparting safety and health and hygiene training to over 2000 students in Noida, Greater Noida and Indirapuram.

Our Raddi collection initiative has 9 housing societies doing the collections and has an involvement of about 4000 people.

Our senior citizens are involved in teaching and preparing the children for a happy life ahead.

With such a dedicated and involved team it is such a pleasure to be a part of the process of educating the children and taking care of the senior citizens.

I feel privileged and learn new things each day by this association with Sunshine Society.






The Outreach

Year 2017-18 saw an increase in the number of sponsored students by 9.35%. This was due to the increase in number of sponsors because of the increasing reach of the NGO and mutual trust and cooperation. The non-sponsored children also saw a sharp increase by 23.21%

The number of students in After school study centres (ASCs) also saw a motivating increase of 22.08% as compared to FY 2016-17. This shows a positive pattern of increasing number of students in After school study centres.










EXPENDITURE INCURRED DONATIONS RECEIVED

EXPENDITURE FY 2017-18



The total expenses account for INR 2886263 for the FY 2017-18 as compared to INR 1949181 for FY 2016-17 with administrative expenses being kept minimal every year.


Total amount of Donation received for the financial year was INR 3153707 with major contributor being the Education segment.

Growth Snapshot: FY 2017-18 vis a vis 2015-16

Sunshine Society which has been actively working in Noida & Indirapuram since it's inception has grown manifolds. The growth pattern can be seen in the graph below marked on four major indicators: Total number of students studying in schools (including sponsored & non-sponsored students), Total number of students in After school study centres in Noida & Indirapuram, Number of sponsors (including individual donors & corporate sponsors) and Associated schools.



Total number of students in schools show a growth of 212.69% indicating an enormous increase in the outreach of Sunshine Society to bring more and more children to school and provide them with basic education.

Total number of students in the After school study centres of Sunshine show a growth of 486% indicating the success of enrichment classes conducted there for the holistic development of our students.

Sponsors who are the backbone of Sunshine also see an upward trend with a growth of 69.76%. This indicates the positive reach of the NGO and the trust which has been entrusted in it.

Schools which are selected after careful examination based on different parameters & specifications decided by the Sunshine team has shown an increasing growth of 125%, though there has been a marginal decline in the number of schools in FY 2017-18 as compared to 2016-17.

The trendline for all the above 4 indicators shows an upward movement indicating no stopping for Sunshine in future.

Shining Stories



Aanchal, a student of B.Sc (Hons) Mathematics at Shaheed Rajguru College of Applied Sciences for Women, Delhi University scored 85% in 12th board examination, UP Board. A warm, bright and self motivated girl, Aanchal has been with Sunshine Society from class 7th. Due to family pressure and financial problems in the family, her education could have been discontinued in class 6th itself. It was here when Aanchal's mother asked Sunshine to intervene. Sunshine took the responsibility and is trying to help out Aanchal in every possible way. With her mother passing away last year, Aanchal was shattered but she came out strong from the irreparable loss and continues to aim for a bright future ahead!!

Shilpi is now a student of B.Sc Nursing at Metro College, Greater Noida. With an inspiring 81% in her class 12th examination, UP Board, Shilpi aims to make her career in Nursing. Life was not easy and comfortable for Shilpi who is with us from class 7th. Financial pressures could have hampered her education but she was fortunate to get a sponsor from Sunshine to fund her education and this kept her educational needs rolling. Shilpi's brother is a self earner and sponsors his education himself. From such a motivating background, we are sure Shilpi will be able to achieve her aim soon making the entire team of Sunshine proud.





Shikha has been with Sunshine Society right from class 3. Now a student of B.Com at Rajkiya Govt. College, Noida, Chaudhary Charan Singh University scored 71.6% in class 12th board examination, UP Board. An enthusiastic, mature and sincere girl, Shikha has always been very regular with her studies or any other activity of Sunshine. With her focus to make a career in the field of commerce, this girl can actually cross all the hurdles in her path to success. Sunshine Society stands strong with her and will do whatever is needed to help Shikha achieve her ambition.






