Hence it is that time of the year when we all take a pat on our backs as our children do us proud , of us.

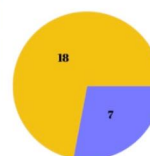

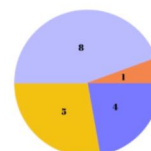

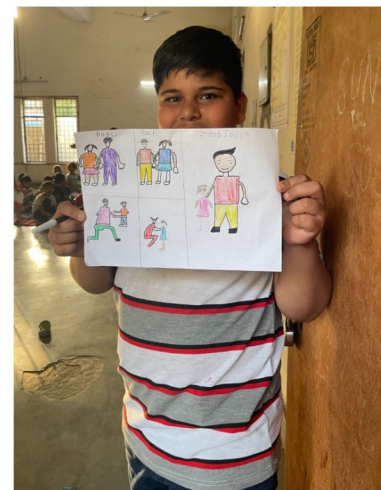

Students picked up the wrappers and plastic waste lying around. They also draw posters to create awareness about the importance of cleanliness.



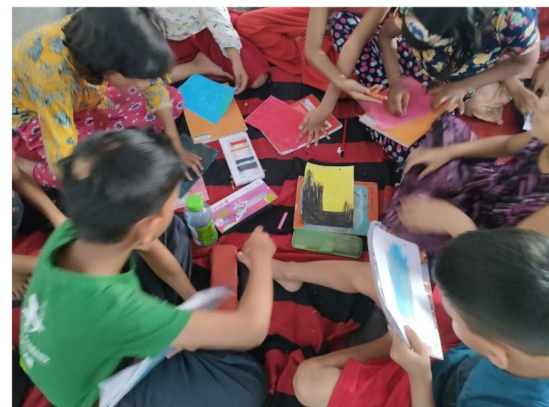
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Art Workshops

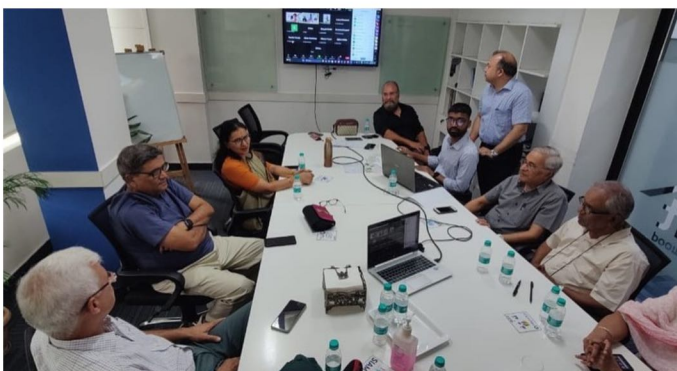
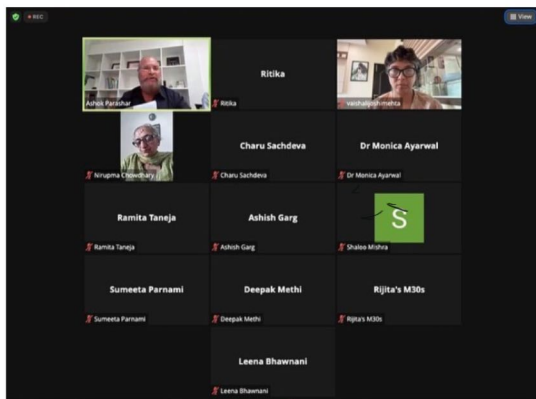


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Change of Guard
